## 4.1. Description of first aid measures

#### **General information**

Provide fresh air. Remove casualty to fresh air and keep warm and at rest.

## After inhalation

Provide fresh air. Medical treatment necessary. Remove affected person from the danger area and lay down. If unconscious place in recovery position and seek medical advice.
